# ANIMAL TRACKS

As you walk through the woodlands you may find signs that other animals have walked through the area. Animal tracks such as footprints can be easier to find in muddy areas.

Keep your eyes open and see what different animal tracks you can find.

Woodpigeon put one foot in front of the other when they walk



Badgers have 5 toes, claws and a broad rear pad



Dog prints have 4 toes and claws



Deer make 2 slots because they bear their weight on 2 toes



The A-shape in a horse's hoofprint is made by the *frog*, a part of the hoof that helps the horse feel what it is standing on



Hedgehogs have broader front feet and narrow back feet



What animal makes these prints?

Sparrows hop along with their feet next to each other



You can see the webbing between the toes of goose footprints
